



PARKING AND CAMPING AT HORSEPLAY 2010

CAR PARKING ARRANGEMENTS

FRIDAY

See camping arrangements

SATURDAY

Parking is in the event field with access directly from the main road. You can park near to where you will camp, if you are camping. But this will not be right next to your car - within 300 metres at the most.

Those intending to camp and those just running can park in this event field.

Please consider sharing transport.

Caravans and large motorhomes are not recommended.

If you are walking or cycling to the event from Henley please take caution on the main road.

SUNDAY

Please remove any cars from the event field before 1500 on this day.

CODE OF CONDUCT

Please follow the instructions of marshals at all times.

Importantly, it is essential that you;

- DO NOT Drive recklessly. Be aware of slippery ground, other people, children, tents and other cars. Take it easy. Don't rush, both at the event or getting to the event, as the roads in the vicinity will have many participants walking (warming up/jogging nervously) on them too.
- DO NOT Park recklessly. Do park in the designated areas and do not park on verges. Do arrive in plenty of time. After dark, move around the event area cautiously, especially if reversing.
- DO work with us in the plans we have for parking you all at the event.

CAMPING ARRANGEMENTS

If you are joining us from afar on the Friday night and camping from then, then we ask that you arrive BEFORE 11pm, and we will get you settled in, in the appropriate place. We ask that Friday campers are smaller groups, individuals and especially well behaved and quiet.

If you are camping on the Saturday night, then please arrive in good time to get yourself organised. We are sure that you will have liked to have made your tent up before your run.

Camping is not possible on the Sunday night.

CODE OF CONDUCT

Camping is free and on a first come first served basis. To make the camping experience as comfortable as possible, whilst still retaining its wild outdoors atmosphere, we ask the following of you;

- Tents should not exceed 12'x12' unless it is accommodating more than 4 people. Gazebos and tents for common areas are not permitted. Please respect other campers and the ground you are camping on.
- We ask that you take your camping litter away with you. The litter receptacles we provide are for the onsite catering, and our clear-up of the site. It is greatly helped if you can pack-out what you pack-in. If these arrangements are frustrated it may lead to camping fees in the future.
- Please be aware that Open Fires, Gas Barbeques, large 'Calor Gas' bottle style cooking units/heating units (smaller personal gas can cooking appliances are fine) are not allowed in the camp site. (There will be catering options to choose from all day Saturday and well into Saturday night. There will also be a caterer providing options on Friday night and Sunday morning). Anyone found abusing this rule will be politely asked to leave the campsite immediately.
- Glass bottles of any kind are also not permitted in the camp site.

Saturday night will be home to the Coach and Horseplay after party which takes place in a marquee right next to the camp site. There will be superb local Oxfordshire ale on tap and a selection of other drinks.

- The organisers kindly ask that you do not bring your own alcohol into the party marquee as this is a licensed premise. Music will play from approximately 7pm until 12 midnight. Please keep this in mind if you plan to camp.
- There is not a designated quiet area at this event. If you seek quiet then the further you camp from the party tent, the quieter it will be.

Toilets will be provided on site in the form of portable cabins. Toilets will be opened from 5pm on Friday until 10am Sunday morning. Please note there are no shower facilities at this site.

DO's and DON'T's

- **DO** - Come Prepared. Warm Clothes and Sleeping Bags are a must
- **DO** – Respect your new camping neighbours. Not everyone wants to hear you at 2am or too early on Sunday morning
- **DO** – Have fun and remember, we can only keep it free if you keep respecting the grounds
- **DO** – Take your litter way with you, please
- **DON'T** – Bring Stereos, Gas BBQ's, or wood for Open Fires
- **DON'T** – Bring Glass Bottles of any kind into the camp grounds
- **DON'T** – Start a fire. You will be asked to leave immediately
